



What's needed to be a Co-opted Committee Member

- Own points either in your own name or jointly
- Stayed at the Club location on at least 2 different occasions
- Account is paid in full
- Must be able to commit to attend 5 Committee Meetings per annum (2 at the resort 2 in the UK and the AGM)
- Be available to answer questions and queries from other members throughout your term of office
- MUST HAVE:-
- Commitment, able to handle sensitive information, good listening skills, business acumen and financial understanding, ability to learn, able to voice not only own opinions but those of members,

The Definition of the Non-Executive Role

 A non-executive director or external director is a member of the board of directors of a company or organisation who does not form part of the executive management team. They are not employees of the company or affiliated with it in any other way and are differentiated from inside directors, who are members of the board who also serve or previously served as executive managers of the company. However they do have the same legal duties, responsibilities and potential liabilities as their executive counterparts.
